


Wildcard who is winless in eight Ryder Cup matches. In poor form. Likely to play with Jimmy Walker.

Wildcard making second Ryder Cup appearance. Was unbeaten on debut. Big-hitter likely to be used in the fourballs.


US Open champion with a winning Ryder Cup record. A key member of the American side and should play five matches.

Powerhouse Floridian qualified automatically for the team, but has been in poor form in the build-up to this week.



MATT KUCHAR

Age **38** Ryder Cups Three (2010, 2012, 2014) Overall record P11, W4, L5, H2 Foursomes W1, L2, H0 Fourballs W2, L1, H2 Singles W1, L2, H0 World ranking 17

Wildcard selection who has never been on a winning side. Solid all-rounder who is likely to partner Dustin Johnson.


The oldest member of Team USA. Slated captain Tom Watson after the last defeat. Mercurial talent playing in 11th Ryder Cup.

Age **33** Ryder Cups Rookie World ranking 31


Earned last-gasp wildcard pick after finishing runner-up in the Tour Championship last Sunday. Steady operator should see foursomes action.

Was the star man for USA in the last match at Gleneagles. A Ryder Cup natural who should win plenty of points.



BRANDT SNEDEKER

Great putter who can be loose with the driver. Unlikely to be employed for more than two sessions before the Sunday singles.



JORDAN SPIETH

Age 23 Ryder Cups One (2014)Overall record P4, W2, L1, H1 Foursomes W0, L0, H1 Fourballs W2, L0, H0 Singles W0, L1, H0 World ranking 4

Former world number one seems set to team up with Patrick Reed in a fearsome all-star pairing. Points should flow.



JIMMY WALKER

Age **37** Ryder Cups One (2014)Overall record P5, W1, L1, H3 Foursomes W0, L1, H1 Fourballs W0, L0, H2 Singles W1, L0, H0 World ranking 16

Won the USPGA Championship at the end of July, but has been inconsistent since. Likely to team up with Rickie Fowler.

RAFAEL CABRERA-BELLO

Age **32** Ryder Cups Rookie World ranking 30

Spaniard who qualified automatically for Ryder Cup debut. Has won only twice on the European Tour. Nervous character. Weak link.



MATTHEW FITZPATRICK

Age 22 Ryder Cups Rookie World ranking 44

English youngster with perfect swing. Former US Amateur champion. Good matchplay record but making Ryder Cup debut.



SERGIO GARCIA

Age **36** Ryder Cups Seven (1999, 2002, 2004, 2006, 2008, 2012, 2014) Overall record P32, W18, L9, H5 Foursomes W9, L2, H2 Fourballs W6, L3, H3 Singles W3, L4, H0 World ranking 12


Ryder Cup legend with a fantastic record in the event. Won on the US Tour in May. Set to partner Rafa Cabrera-Bello.



MARTIN KAYMER

Age **31** Ryder Cups Three (2010, 2012, 2014) Overall record P10, W4, L3, H3 Foursomes W0, L0, H2 Fourballs W2, L2, H1 Singles W2, L1, H0 World ranking 48

Gutsy German holed the decisive putt in the last Ryder Cup on American soil. Dual Major champion and consistent performer.



RORY MCILROY

Age 27 Ryder Cups Three (2010, 2012, 2014) Overall record P14, W6, L4, H4 Foursomes W3, L2, H1 Fourballs W1, L2, H2 Singles W2, L0, H1 World ranking 3

Won two of the last three FedEx Cup playoff events to arrive at Hazeltine bursting with confidence. The star of the team and likely to play five matches.



THOMAS PIETERS

Age 24 Ryder Cups Rookie World ranking 42

The Belgian bomber was handed a wildcard after impressive late-summer form. Should see fourballs action.

JUSTIN ROSE

Age **36** Ryder Cups Three (2008, 2012, 2014) Overall record P14, W9, L3, H2 Foursomes W4, L1, H1 Fourballs W3, L2, H0 Singles W2, L0, H1 World ranking 11

Won the Olympics for Great Britain last month. Former US Open champion with an excellent Ryder Cup record. Likely to team up with Henrik Stenson.



HENRIK STENSON

Age **40** Ryder Cups Three (2006, 2008, 2014) Overall record P11, W5, L4, H2 Foursomes W2, L1, H1 Fourballs W2, L1, H1 Singles W1, L2, H0 World ranking 5

A knee injury sustained in the FedEx Cup playoffs is a worry. If fit, the Open champion should win plenty of points alongside Justin Rose.



ANDY SULLIVAN

Age **29** Ryder Cups Rookie World ranking 50

Genial Midlander who qualified for the team automatically. Recent form poor, but set for fourballs action alongside Rory McIlroy.



LEE WESTWOOD

Age **43** Ryder Cups Nine (1997, 1999, 2002, 2004, 2006, 2008, 2010, 2012, 2014) Overall record P41, W20, L15, H6 Foursomes W9, L4, H4 Fourballs W8, L5, H2 Singles W3, L6, H0 World ranking 46

The old warhorse of Team Europe, who is bidding to break Nick Faldo's points-scoring record. Likely to partner Danny Willett.



DANNY WILLETT

Age **28** Ryder Cups Rookie World ranking 10

Europe's best rookie. The Masters champion should team up with his good friend Lee Westwood in a strong pairing.



CHRIS WOOD

Age **28** Ryder Cups Rookie World ranking 32

The weakest link in Team Europe. The injury-plagued Bristolian qualified through winning at Wentworth in May, but has been unconvincing since.



RYDER CUP: COURSE GUIDE V







Hazeltine National Golf Club, Chaska, Minnesota, USA Length 7,628 yards Par 72



442 yards, par 4

The first hole typifies Hazeltine. The drive zone features fairway bunkers and shots out of the rough will be hard to keep on the tiered green, so an accurate approach shot is crucial.



402 yards, par 4

The drive is over Hazeltine Lake, and must also be kept short of the creek on the left. The narrow, elevated green angles away and is difficult to hold. Hole locations on the right of the green bring the lake back into play.



248 yards, par 3

The hardest par three at Hazeltine has a pond on the left, trees on the right, bunkers front and right, and difficult hole locations provide a variety of challenges.



429 yards, par 4

This dogleg left is an early birdie opportunity. A brave drive around the corner could leave a wedge to the green. But a fairway bunker on the left makes that a risky policy. Those playing safe must stay away from some new bunkers on the right.



186 yards, par 3

The green is surrounded by bunkers and water. A large bowl in the front left will capture any shots that are off the mark. Three putts are common.



448 yards, par 4

Another new tee has added almost 50 yards to this hole. The longest hitters can try to fly the fairway bunkers, but the left rough is the thickest on the course. The green is narrow and the deep bunkers in the front and on the sides are to be avoided at all costs.



633 yards, par 5

The first of three 600-yard plus holes is a real test. The drive must avoid the bunkers on the left and thick rough on the right. Aggressive second shots must stay left side or risk ending up well below the large green in the right rough.



475 yards, par 4

A new tee has lengthened this hole. The approach shots are played to a green with three tiers, so accuracy is at a premium.



405 yards, par 4

The woods on either side of the narrow fairway must be avoided. The long green sits between bunkers on the right and a pond on the left.



210 yards, par 3

Surrounded by bunkers, the green features a shelf that is difficult to hold and a flat area across the front. In between is a slope, so tee shots that make the green but are not close to the hole can still lead to a bogey.



452 yards, par 4

Accuracy off of the tee is critical. The perfect drive is to the corner of the dogleg. From there, the hole plunges down the hill toward Hazeltine Lake. Back left hole locations bring the lake into play and a ridge bisects the green.



572 yards, par 5

The shortest of the par fives at Hazeltine used to see most players going for the green in two when it was 29 yards shorter. A pond on the left prevents easy access and fairway bunkers have been added on the left side of the tee-shot landing area.



352 yards, par 4

A new cross bunker short of the green enhances the risk/reward character of the hole. It looks easy, but accuracy is essential as the green is small.



606 yards, par 5

518 yards, par 4

Attempts to reach the green in two that come up short on the third 600-yarder may find a new bunker from which birdie will be an unlikely score.



176 yards, par 3

The small green encircled by water and sand is anything but easy. Those who try to play it aggressively can pay the price.



A new tee has added length to the hole, bringing bunkers back into play, which should lead to higher scores, especially into the wind.



One of the hardest holes on the course has had 50 yards added with a new tee. The green is shallow and firm, making approach shots difficult. Most putts are flat, but there are subtle breaks to watch out for.



Bunkers on both sides of the fairway make this one of the most difficult driving holes. Hitting uphill into a green that's difficult to see means players have to get their yardage right.
